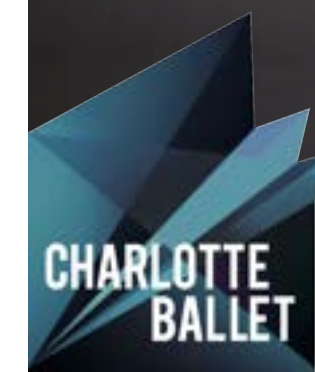

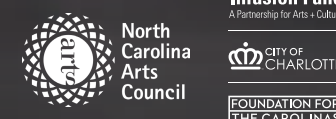

Innovation is unlimited in this fan-favorite series which includes three new works created for Charlotte Ballet. We welcome for the first time Jennifer Archibald, founder and director of the Arch Dance Company in New York City and Cincinnati Ballet's Resident Choreographer. Also featured will be the 2021 Guggenheim Fellow and University of North Carolina School of the Arts alum Helen Simoneau, whose dance-making explores proximity, intimacy and personal space. Rounding out the program will be a new work by one of Charlotte Ballet's own artists.

DAY OF DANCE PROGRAM

Recommended for Middle and High School Students

Charlotte Ballet's Day of Dance is an educational experience for students at our facility in uptown Charlotte. Through this program, we aim to expand students' knowledge of the field and fuel a strong appreciation for the arts by shedding light on the inner workings of an arts organization. Students will:

- Get a Behind the Scenes Tour
- Take Master Class
- Learn about Careers in Dance through a Q&A with Charlotte Ballet staff

Length of program: 2 and half hours

Cost: \$500, 25 students maximum

SCHOOL RESIDENCIES

Charlotte Ballet offers three residency opportunities: repertory residencies, arts integrated residencies and Dance A Story workshops. Professional dancers and/or teaching artists will spend a day, a week or months at your school in a residency program.

DANCE A STORY WORKSHOPS are a fun, interactive 45-minute workshop held at your school. Appropriate for elementary age students, Dance A Story integrates kinesthetic learning with reading, introducing children to the world of ballet through classic stories, creative movement and music, including a “prop costume” show and tell.

Cost: \$150

REPATORY PERFORMANCES are an opportunity for dance classes for grades 6-12 to learn Charlotte Ballet's riveting repertory. Classic and contemporary ballets serve as a catalyst, inspiring student learning through Charlotte Ballet's repertoire.

Cost: Based on length of residency

ARTS INTEGRATED RESIDENCIES explore topics from language arts, mathematics, science or social studies curricula, through dance composition and performance for K-12 students.

Cost: Based on length of residency

LAST STOP ON MARKET STREET

Join Charlotte Ballet II as they venture into a wonderful bus ride celebrating people of all different backgrounds. *Last Stop on Market Street*, written by Matt De la Pena chronicles CJ on a bus ride with his grandmother. CJ has many questions about the people around him and his grandmother teaches him to appreciate the real beauty in the world and in people. Pre and post lesson plans, as well as activities, will be available to better prepare students for this wonderful experience.

MIDDLE, HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS AND POST-SECONDARY

CLASSICAL VS CONTEMPORARY

Charlotte Ballet II will take you on a journey to explore the similarities and differences between Classical and Contemporary Ballet. Students will have the opportunity to see excerpts of *Under the Lights*, set to the music of the iconic Johnny Cash, all while comparing it to the Black Swan classical variation. This interactive performance will allow students to explore the choreographic process, dance movement skills and compare and contrast additional company repertory. The performance will include a comprehensive Study Guide for students and educators with biographies of the dancers, history of the Company and pre/post lesson plans.
